

During the course of the season, we will need **68 timers! This is not including invitationals/champs.** ALL families need to time AT LEAST one swimmeet.... Timing is a great way to get up close and personal with the swimming and on hot nights, its nice to be right by the water :)

Here are some FAQ's:

1. WHAT DO I DO?

-Simply sign up for a meet. About 15 minutes before the start, there will be a TIMERS MEETING that one of the meet officials will hold. You will be given a watch. One button starts and stops the time. The other button clears the time. The official will tell you what to look for to start the watch and what to look for at the finish to stop the watch.

2. DO I HAVE TO TIME THE ENTIRE MEET?

-When you commit to a meet, you are expected to time for all 74 events. If you'd like to tag team with a spouse or a friend, feel free to do so. Don't hesitate to take a break when you need, we have relief timers to give you a break.

3. WHAT IF I MAKE A MISTAKE?

-There is a backup timer who will start a watch with every start. If you don't get your watch started promptly, the backup timer can switch watches with you, just call out for back up timer.

Keep in mind, there are 3 timers per lane, the 3 times are averaged to get the swimmer's time. One home timer per lane will document the times. So as a newcomer to timing, all you need to do is start/stop and tell the time to the person with the clipboard.

By the time that the medley relays are over, you will feel like a pro! It's really fun, I highly recommend it! THANKS to those who have signed up so far!
